

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When I was in high school, I had the chance to play the part of John the Baptist in a production of "Godspell." As you may know, that same character is also Judas Iscariot. In a unique twist, my classmate who portrayed Jesus was an atheist. So the cast included atheist-Jesus and future-priest-Judas. Anyway, in an early scene, John the Baptist recites much of today's Gospel passage, beginning with the words "You brood of vipers." What a way to start a monologue!

Those tough words from John the Baptist certainly fit his camel-hair-garment-wearing style and his desert living arrangements. John is not a quiet figure, nor is he docile. With great courage and conviction, he cries out, demanding to be heard, heralding the coming of Jesus. However, the picture he paints of the coming Messiah, one with winnowing fan in hand, who will drive out the chaff and burn it in unquenchable fire, at first does not seem to jive with the tiny baby born in Bethlehem, or the gentle shepherd who preaches a message of peace.

On closer examination, though, we see that John's words are very much in line with who Jesus is. The Gospel that Jesus preaches is so radically different that he does, in fact, stir up considerable conversation and debate. Jesus is unflinching in his commandment to love and in speaking the truth about what God wants for every person – so much so that, when people begin to walk away from him because his teaching is too hard, as we see in the Gospel of John, chapter 6, Jesus does not go after them or change his tone. Rather, he holds fast in the truth, and respecting their freedom, allows them to walk away. John the Baptist then is giving us a very real portrait of Jesus and what He will do when He comes.

And so for us: have we allowed Jesus with His winnowing fan to drive out the chaff in our own hearts? Have we taken Him seriously when he tells us to be mindful of the poor, orphaned, widowed, abandoned, alien, and oppressed? Do we think as men think rather than as God thinks? Have we allowed ourselves to be confronted by the truth of God's mercy, power, and grace? As we continue our Advent journey, may this week be one of purification, a time to get rid of the clutter that distracts us from our relationship with Jesus and allows us to walk confidently toward the great feast of Christmas.

FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

As Catholics, we pause and honor Mary. This
 wonderful feast celebrates the gift of God to Mary in
 preserving her from original sin from the moment of
 her existence. Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma
 of the **Immaculate Conception** took place on
 December 8, 1854. In Paris in 1830, Mary appeared to
 Catherine Laboure and declared herself to be the
Immaculate Conception. Between February 11, 1858,
 and July 16, 1858, the Blessed Virgin appeared to a
 young peasant girl, Bernadette Soubirous, eighteen
 times at the grotto of Massabielle in Lourdes, France.
 On March 24 Bernadette was instructed to have a
 chapel built in honor of the Blessed Virgin, and on the
 following day Mary identified herself as the
Immaculate Conception. Also in the mid-1800s, the
 American bishops placed our relatively new country
 under the protection of Mary as the Immaculate
 Conception.
