Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Gospel parable we hear today is a familiar one. Naturally, we all want our hearts to correspond to that good soil our Lord references, but we are also alert to the ways in which we receive the word with rocky soil, or of the thorns that spring up and get in the way. The best way for us to keep good soil available for God in our hearts is through a regular life of prayer and sacramental grace. This means praying daily, Mass each week, and some regularity with the sacrament of Confession. Some other tremendous helps to these fundamentals include frequent prayer of the Rosary and regular visits to the Blessed Sacrament (I highly recommend stopping by our Adoration chapel during the week!).

Just as there is work we can do to cultivate our hearts for the Lord, there is a corresponding effort the Lord makes toward us. The Prophet Isaiah reminds us of this in the first reading as he tells us of the providential care that God gives his creation. It is God who sets the world in motion and who gives us everything we need. Fortunately, the life of grace does not depend on us! Rather, God wants to, and in fact does, pour out grace upon grace, so that we can grow according to his plan and design.

I am writing this while on the road for a seminary class reunion. While I will be home for the weekend, I will have spent several days with priests from around the country with whom I studied for and prepared for the priesthood. Some I have seen regularly, while others I have not seen in a decade or more. The years since our ordination have been a time of real growth. I cannot help but look back on these years and see the efforts we have made, but also notice how those efforts are dwarfed by the grace of God that has been providentially guiding us and leading the way. This weekend, let us all look at our own lives and notice the places where God's grace has been at work, where we have cooperated with that grace, and where the Lord is inviting us to a deeper receptivity to his gifts that are always being poured out.

PLACES TO PRAY

Nestled in the northern end of Bridgeport, Saint Margaret's Shrine is appropriately hailed as "an oasis for prayer in Connecticut." On the feast of the Immaculate Conception in 1941—one day after the attack on Pearl Harbor—Father Emilio lasiello resolved to steward the plot of land he had recently purchased into a chapel to the Prince of Peace. It was his hope that this chapel would provide the city's parishioners with a place to pray for world peace and for those serving in the military. In less than a year, this chapel would bear the patronage of St. Margaret of Antioch in its dedication on September 30, 1942.

The foundational chapel stands today amongst a sea of shrines that have been added to the property over the years. Many of these additions were introduced in the 1940-50s and were handcrafted by artisanal parishioners and their relatives. The rocky terrain features terraces, grottos, and walkways that you can interact with at your leisure, and there are wide stone paths in place to help facilitate access to the many meditation spots.

Daily Mass and Reconciliation are celebrated at the Shrine. The website's homepage contains all pertinent information regarding dates, times, and language offerings (English or Italian), as well as a list of the shrines housed on the property and an accompanying description. Visitors are welcome to prayerfully walk the grounds daily between the hours of 8am-6pm.

One is immediately enveloped by the outstretched arms of countless depictions of saints, Jesus, and Mother Mary upon entering the Shrine. Given that the shrines are life-sized and therefore constructed on a large scale, one can, for example, kneel beside a statue of Jesus in Gethsemane and pray alongside Him. In this way, Saint Margaret's Shrine deepens our understanding of how intimate our relationship with God is and how He truly longs for us to enter into the mystery of our Faith with Him. - Hope Hoittos

CO-OP MISSION SUNDAY

Maranatha Caring Mission was established to provide free medical clinics in developing countries, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, provide clean water to the thirsty, and other works as the Spirit directs.

The first clinic was established on November 12, 2016, in Umueje, Anambra State, Nigeria. Eye disease is very prevalent in this area, and many suffer from cataracts. Umueje and the surrounding communities are riverine and riverblindness is prominent due to water parasites.

Maranatha has provided free medical care to **53,876** patients and performed **462** free cataracts and pterygium surgeries. We also perform other surgeries including appendectomy, herniorrhaphy, hydrocelectomy and fibroid removal.

Right now, there are **280** patients on the wait list for cataract surgeries and **70** patients on the wait list for herniorrhaphy and hydrocelectomy. It only costs **\$100** to perform one cataract surgery and **\$20** to provide one month of eye care after the cataract surgery. One appendectomy or herniorrhaphy costs **\$50** and fibroid surgery costs **\$150**.

To continue to provide free medical care, we need your HELP! Your financial support will allow us to perform surgeries for the impoverished patients on the wait list. Your generosity will positively impact the health and the well-being of those in need.
